The Scarecrows have received a lot of attention from passing motorists who slow down when they see them.

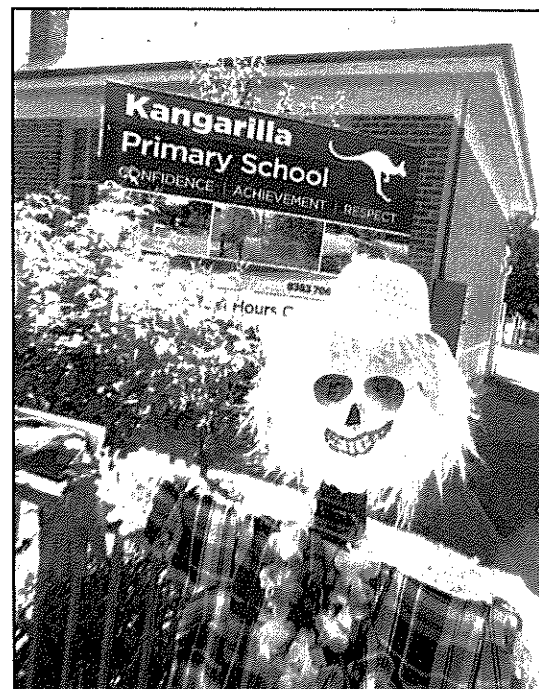
Many cars stop and people come and take
